

# Il Colonnato, Dining table 280 x 140

## Description

In this project, Mario Bellini took his inspiration from a basic elemental structure in architecture. His design emulated the colonnade of classical architecture, in which a sequence of columns supports a portico, in this case a table top. The base is a visually closed volume, despite being materially open. When seen from a different viewpoint, perception changes completely, as the columns no longer overlap and the space appears empty.

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### Cleaning Instructions


Use a soft damp cloth, with soap or neutral detergent.

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


If the tables are moved assembled, this can cause stresses on the inserts, and can create cracks.

If the tables need to be lifted/handled/moved, it is necessary to disassemble it, by removing the legs from the top.




The packed top must always be handled and transported vertically, the tops must never be transported horizontally.

Always handle the top in more than two people, located at equidistant points.






## Template sheet legend

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
For the assembly of Dining table 280 x 140, break the "A" holes  
For the assembly of Dining table 140 x 140, break the "B" holes



- 1 Place the sheets on the ground matching the two central holes of each template




- 2 Place the legs in the bold positions




- 3 Once all the legs are placed, rotate them until they align with the small holes in the templates.




- 4 Unscrew the center leg plates and screw on the dual mounting kit.



- 5 Screw on the dual mountin kit on the central plates




- 6 Finally, place one of the table tops above the legs and screw it. Then, do the same with the other table top.

- 1 Place the template sheet on the ground and place the legs in the bold positions






- 1 Break the template holes, place the template sheet on the ground and put the legs in the round positions
